


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Testament and last Will of Elizabeth K. Edkin

 make and declare this my last Will and
 Testament, 1st My will is that all my
 household goods, furniture, bedding and all
 other household property of every kind now

 description of which I shall die seized and
 possessed or to which I shall be entitled at
 the time of my decease, be sold at Public
 Sale as soon after my decease as shall be
 found convenient, 2nd I do hereby give
 devise and bequeath the money realized from
 said sale, (after payment of all my just
 debts and funeral charges and all other
 charges whatsoever) to my beloved son
 Rinaldo C. Taylor (at the present time re-
 siding in Iowa City State of Iowa, to be
 paid to him by my Executor or Executors
 hereinafter named so soon as possible; to
 have and to hold the same to him and his
 heirs, executors administrators and assigns
 forever, 3rd I do hereby appoint and con-
 stitute my friends Robert Colburn, William
 Taylor and David Hall Junior, or each of
 them as shall accept this trust as Executor
 or Executor of this my last will and testament
 In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my
 hand and seal this twentieth day of September
 in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
 hundred and fifty four.
